Why This Course Should Be Important to You:

According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, 205,000 children are treated for playground accidents annually, with approximately 15 resulting in death. Of these, 70% occurred at public parks and schoolyards. **Does your equipment measure up? How many preventable injuries occurred in your parks?**

Sponsored by the **Illinois Park and Recreation Association (IPRA)** and the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA), this course is the most comprehensive training program offered on playground hazard identification and risk management methods. Advanced reading and ten hours of training will prepare you to take the Certified Playground Safety Inspector (CPSI) Exam, which will take place on the last day.

CERTIFICATION

Those taking the course are eligible to take the Certified Playground Safety Inspectors Exam, but must register for the exam which is given on the third day of the Institute. Upon successful completion of the course and exam, you will be certified through the National Recreation and Park Association as a Certified Playground Safety Inspector (CPSI) for three years. Certificates will be awarded and your name will be added to the national roster of CPSIs. Certification is valid for three years and is renewable. You will receive your results within four to six weeks after taking the exam. Please address all renewal questions to NRPA at 703/858-2148 or info@nrpa.org.

PRE-COURSE STUDY MATERIALS

You will receive written resource materials to study as soon as your registration is processed. This study time is highly recommended and NRPA/NPSI advises not taking the exam if the materials have not been thoroughly read.
