FROM 294 NORTH TRI-STATE TOLLWAY:

To the High School: Travel north and exit at Dempster street east. Go east on Dempster to first light (Potter road). Main East is on the corner of Dempster and Potter.
To the Senior Center: Travel north and exit Touhy east. Travel east on Touhy to Western (third light). Turn right at Western and the Senior Center is the second building on the right.
To Tam Golf Course: Travel north and exit Touhy east. Travel east on Touhy to Harlem Avenue. Turn left on Harlem. Travel on Harlem north to Howard Street. Turn right on Howard. Travel east on Howard about 1/2 mile to Tam Golf Course on the left.
To Brunswick Zone: Travel north to Golf Road. Exit Golf Road east. Travel east on Golf Road to Potter Road. Turn right (south) on Potter Road. Travel south on Potter to Dempster. Turn right (west) on Dempster. Travel west to Rand Road (Route 12). Turn right on Rand Road. Go west on Rand Road to Brunswick Zone.
To Rolling Meadows Senior Center: Travel north and exit 290 west/Northwest Tollway. Take 290 west to 53 north. Travel on 53 north to Kirchoff. Exit Kirchoff east. Travel east to Meadow. Turn right on Meadow to Martin. Turn right on Martin to Pheasant.
To Highland Park Country Club: Travel North on 294. to Lake Cook Road exit on Lake Cook and Turn Right on Lake Cook Road. Merge onto US - 41 N. Skokie Highway via ramp toward Waukegan. Travel on 41 North to Park Av. West Turn Right to 1401 Park Av. West.
To Park Ridge Park District Community Center: Travel north to Touhy Ave. Exit Touhy Ave. east. Go to third stoplight which is Western. Community Center is at the corner of Touhy and Western.
To Northbrook Sports Club: Take 294 North toward Wisconsin to Route 137 (Buckley Road.) Go west on Buckley Road which turns into Peterson Road (name change only) at Route 21. Take Peterson west to Allegheny. At Allegheny, turn right (north) and continue to Sports Club Drive which is on the left.
To Schaumburg Park District Sports Center: Take 294 North to I-290 west. Follow signs "To Rockford" and "Northwest suburbs" to 53/ I-290 west. Exit at Thorndale Road to Elgin-O'Hare Expressway. Continue straight onto Elgin-O'Hare Expressway. Exit at Wright Blvd. Turn left (south) onto Wright Blvd. Turn right (west) onto Irving Park Road. Sports Center is ahead on the left.
To Community Athletic Fields, ElkGrove Village: Travel north and exit I-90 west. Exit Arlington Heights Rd. Go south on Arlington Heights Rd. to Devon. Turn left (east) on Devon then exit into Community Athletic Fields on the right.
To Pyramid Club, Addison: Travel north and exit merge onto I-290 west. Take the US-20 W/Lake St. exit toward York Road (exit 12). Take the US-20 W/Lake St. ramp toward IL-64 W. Turn slight right onto W. Lake St. and end at 236 W. Lake St.

FROM 294 SOUTH TRI-STATE TOLLWAY:

To the High School: Travel south and exit Golf Road east. Travel east on Golf to Potter Road. Turn right (south) on Potter and go to Dempster. Main East High School is located at Dempster and Potter.
To the Senior Center: Travel south and exit Golf Road east. Travel east to Potter Road. Turn right (south) on Potter. Travel south on Potter to Busse Highway. Turn left on Busse Highway and go east to Dee Road. Turn right (south) on Dee Road to Touhy Avenue. Turn left on Touhy Avenue. Travel east on Touhy to Western Avenue. Turn right at Western Avenue and the Senior Center is the second building on the right.
To Norridge Park District: Exit Kennedy Expressway to Chicago. Kennedy to Cumberland South exit. Travel south on Cumberland to Lawrence. Turn left on Lawrence. Lawrence to Overhill. Turn right on Overhill to Norridge Park.
To Tam Golf Course: Travel south and exit Golf Road east. Travel east to Milwaukee Avenue. Turn right on Milwaukee Avenue and travel to Howard Street. Turn left on Howard to Tam Golf Course.
To Brunswick Zone: Travel south and exit Dempster west. Travel west on Dempster to Rand Road (Route 12). Travel west on Rand Road to Brunswick Zone.
To Rolling Meadows Park District: Travel south and exit 290 west/Northwest Tollway. Take 290 to 53 north. Travel on 53 north to Kirchoff. Exit Kirchoff east. Travel east to Meadow. Turn right on Meadow to Martin. Turn right on Martin to Pheasant.
To Highland Park Country Club: Travel South on 294 Exit Half Day Road. Turn Right on Skokie Valley Road (US 41 S) Travel on US 41 S to Park Avenue. Turn Left on Park Avenue West to 1201 Park Avenue West.
To Park Ridge Park District Community Center: Travel south to Golf Road east. To Potter Road. Turn right (south) on Potter. Take Potter to dead end at Busse Highway. Turn left on Busse Hwy. To Dee Road. Turn right (south) on Dee Road to Touhy. Turn left on Touhy to Western. Community Center is at the corner of Touhy and Western.
To Schaumburg park District Sports Center. Take I-90 west ("To Rockford"). Exit onto 53-I290 South. Exit at Thorndale Road to the Elgin-O'Hare Expressway. Turn right (west) onto the Elgin-O'Hare Expressway. Exit at Wright Blvd, Turn left (south) onto Wright Blvd. Turn right (west) onto Irving Park Road. The Sports Center is ahead on the left.
To Northbrook Sports Club: Travel South on I-294 to Route 137 (Buckley Road). Go west on Buckley which turns into Peterson Rd. (name change only) at Route 21. Take Peterson to Allegheny. At Allegheny, turn right (north) and continue to Sports Club Drive which is on the left.
To: Community Athletic Fields, ElkGrove Village: Travel south and exit I-90 west. Exit Arlington Heights Rd. Go south on Arlington Heights Rd to Devon. Turn east (left) on Devon, then exit into the Community Athletic Fields on the right.
To: Pyrmid Club, Addison: Travel south and merge onto St. ramp too I-290 west. Take US-20/ Lake St. exit toward York Road (exit 12). Take the US-20 w/Lake St. ramp towards IL-64 w. Turn slight right onto W Lake St. and end at 236 w. Lake St.

EVENT RULES

EVENTS

Each participant must bring their own equipment, which must meet all regulations of the competition. The chairperson of each event will run the event and has the authority to make final calls and decisions.

Basketball Free Throw

Twenty-five (25) baskets shot from the free throw line; winners determined by number of baskets made.

Bicycle Race

1/4 mile sprint, one (1) mile and five (5) mile race competition. Helmets are required. No drafting.

Bowling

No handicap system; ABC rules will govern; three (3) games

Golf (18 hole)

Peoria handicap system used in the scoring. Tee time will start at 7:00 a.m. You will be notified of your tee time.

Golf (9 hole)

Peoria handicap. Tee time will start at 7:00 a.m.

Horseshoes

Single elimination tournament.

Pool (Billiards)

8 ball; best two out of three games played.

Swimming

USS rules will govern competition; 25 yard pool.

Table Tennis

Single elimination singles tournament; players must wear a dark shirt and rubber soled shoes.

Tennis

8 game pro set.

Track & Field

AAU rules will govern competition; meter distances will be used in the running events.

Trap Shoot

ATA rules will govern competition; 50 targets. Trap and skeet shoot.

Volleyball

IHSA rules apply. Round Robin tournament.

Walking

One mile race; contact must be maintained with the ground at all times; the leg on the ground must be straightened at the knee for at least one moment of each stride.

Shower facilities are available at the high school. Please bring your own towel and lock.
