

PLANNING & ZONING TRAINING

For Appointed Board & Commission Members, Staff & Elected Officials

In your city or county, the appointed boards and commissions dealing with land use issues are consistently the most controversial, the most likely to be targets of legal actions and have the greatest impact on your jurisdiction's future.

Citizen members of the planning commission, zoning board of appeals and similar boards that regulate development come to their positions with a great deal of knowledge about the community and a genuine desire to serve. Often, though, they do not have much training on the basics of planning and zoning concepts, public meeting and hearing procedures, due process and open meetings requirements, conflicts of interest or strategic planning.
