## NO MYSTERY to Becoming a Fellow in the American Society of Landscape Architects

All ASLA *Members with ten or more continuous years of Full Membership* are *eligible* for Fellowship in the Society. The Florida Chapter Fellows Committee wants to know if you believe you are *electable* to the ASLA Council of Fellows <a href="https://www.asla.org/fellows.aspx">https://www.asla.org/fellows.aspx</a>, or if you want to suggest to the Committee another eligible Member you think is *electable*. Any *eligible* Member whom the Committee believes can be elected, can be nominated by the Florida Chapter ASLA Executive Committee. Only eligible members with a *strong* likelihood of being elected will be recommended for nomination.

Now through June 30, please notify the Chapter president (<a href="mailto:president@flasla.org">president@flasla.org</a>) or Fellows Committee Chair (<a href="mailto:fellowschair@flasla.org">fellowschair@flasla.org</a>) if you want to suggest a member for nomination or want to be nominated yourself. No later than the time of the August 2015 Chapter Executive Committee meeting, <a href="mailto:eligible">eligible</a> Members may be listed in the Fellows Committee report, and recommended for nomination. Fellowship is among the highest honors the ASLA bestows on members and recognizes the contributions of these individuals to their profession and society at large based on their works, leadership and management, knowledge, and service. The designation of Fellow is conferred on individuals in recognition of exceptional accomplishments over a sustained period of time. Individuals considered for this distinction must be full members of ASLA in good standing for at least ten years and must be recommended to the Council of Fellows by the Executive Committee of their local chapter, the Executive Committee of the ASLA, or the Executive Committee of the Council of Fellows.
