ABOUT THE MUSEUM'S ARCHITECTURE



The new Salvador Dali Museum is the design of world-HOK Tampa. HOK's design concept combines the rational with the fantastical: a simple 58-foothigh, right angled Euclidean 'treasure box' with hurricane-proof walls that protect the art. The new 68,000 square foot facility is home to the largest collection of Salvador Dali masterworks in the world. It doubles the size of the original one story warehouse Dali Museum built in 1982. The museum contains

2,140 Dali paintings, prints, sculptures and drawings and welcomes visitors from around the world.



ABOUT THE MUSEUM'S LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE

To complement the unique building design, the firm of Phil Graham Landscape Architecture located in St. Petersburg, Florida was commissioned to design the site's garden spaces. The landscape is laden with surprises to delight the visitor and stimulate insights related to the artworks within the museum. *The mathematical garden* allows visitors to experience the relationship between math and nature. The principal of Pi is exhibited through a series of stepping-stone patterns. *Golden*



rectangle and spiral- A facsimile of the original proportion used by artists throughout the centuries as the most perfect of spatial ratios, is embedded in the pavement of the East Garden *Sliding garden gates* disappear between large, precision-cut boulders. *A winding labyrinth* modeled after a labyrinth at Chartres Cathedral in France, is a sheer delight for children and adults alike. *The melting bench* a nod to Salvador Dali's 1931 painting, "The Persistence of Memory," is a well-known reference to surreal painting, and favorite among visitors.
