The conference theme and concept is perfected and all the logistics are organized by this committee with the resources of our association management team in assistance.

It is the volunteerism of the conference committee that leads planning efforts overall, but the entire ASLA Florida executive committee also plays an important role with details. The education and research committee is responsible for soliciting instructors for courses, and getting the courses approved for continuing education credits. The public relations and marketing committee assists with advertising and public relations, and broadcasting the important conference news. The membership committee, advocacy and licensure committee, and our University representatives each play important roles throughout the year to provide support with fundraising for scholarships, organize membership initiatives, and to provide volunteer staff to work at the event so that functions run smoothly.

So, next week, we will look forward to seeing you at conference !
