

But the 13-year-old's steel facade cracked when an artist in residence at the University of Maryland Children's Center recently asked him to draw the first thing that popped in his head. Josh sketched out a beach — and then he started crying.

Message from AATA National Office: "Marty Weishaar, referenced in this article, has a Master's degree in Art Therapy from an AATA-EPAB approved program. He is in the process of completing requirements for his credentials and the Maryland state art therapy license. He expects to have these in the next few months. His employer chose to report the title 'artist in residence' to be clear that he is not acting as a licensed clinician. AATA and the Maryland Art Therapy Association (MATA) shared the proper educational requirements with the reporter and have asked the Sun to print that clarification. Marty personally has been advocating to bring art therapy to UMCC and has been working directly with Maryland's First Lady to launch the program since November of 2016. 
