The AATA and the ACA Issue Joint Response to the Attorney ${}^{f f}$ **General's Remarks on Mental Health in Higher Institutions**

On July 24th the Attorney General Jeff Sessions addressed an audience of high schoolers at Turning Point USA's High School Leadership Summit and accused many higher institutions of "doing everything they can to create a generation of sanctimonious, sensitive, supercilious snowflakes." In his remarks, he listed therapy dogs, art materials – specifically coloring books and playdough – and art activities, such as encouraging students to "draw about their feelings," as examples. The American Art Therapy Association and the American Counseling Association (ACA) collaborated in writing a formal response, asserting that his "remarks were highly misguided and they further stigmatize young people who seek mental health services and ways to manage stress at a critical transitional time in their lives."
