California Trucking Association Addresses SB 32's Implications on the Trucking Industry

(SACRAMENTO)—In response to the governor signing SB 32 today, California Trucking Association CEO Shawn Yadon issued the following statement to highlight the concerns and significant implications SB 32 will have on the state’s trucking industry:

“California truckers have spent nearly \$1 billion per year to comply with the nation’s strictest air quality mandates. SB 32 doubles down on these requirements without any added protection or certainty for our members that investments in today’s cleanest technologies will not be stranded tomorrow.

To meet SB 32’s 2030 goal with today’s technology and fuels we would have had to park trucks for the year back in August.

While we want to be part of a climate change solution, we need the Legislature to dive into the details of SB 32 and work to ensure that its implementation doesn’t do more damage to industries like ours.”
