- Key details about road closures, evacuation routes, port closures and other supply chain impacts
- News about other notable Harvey-related developments
- And an overview of any requests for assistance we've received

It's a great place to go if you have any questions about Florence, other named storms, or the latest relief efforts, and we will be updating it often as circumstances and needs change. We also encourage you to download the [FEMA Mobile App](#) to get weather alerts, preparedness tools, and disaster-related resources and information.

Stay Connected. In related news, ALAN is busily preparing to provide supply chain support when and where it's required.
