

Increase in Saskatchewan's Minimum Wage Rate

On December 1st, 2012, the Government of Saskatchewan will increase the province's minimum wage rate from its current rate of \$9.50 per hour to \$10.00 per hour. This increase will also result in a corresponding increase to the minimum call-out pay to \$30.00.

All employers with employees being paid minimum wage rates will be required to make the mandatory adjustments effective December 1, 2012.

This increase is part of the Government's overall review of labour relations and employment legislation that is presently underway. The Government has stated that it is still considering indexing Saskatchewan's minimum wage rate.
