This paper chronicles the ways in which the art therapy clinical team enabled the children to tell their stories and symbolize the traumatic memories of 9/11. The art therapy services provided a safe environment in which the children were enabled to express and to be validated in their experiences of profound loss, confusion, and vulnerability, underscoring the effectiveness of art therapy in trauma treatment.

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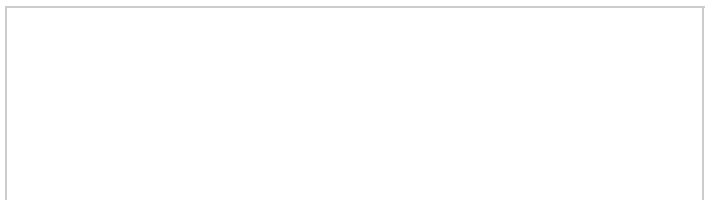
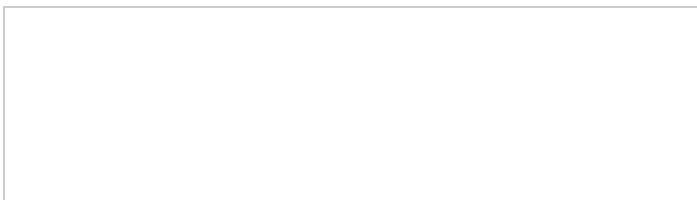
## Potential E-mail Scam Targeting Art Therapists

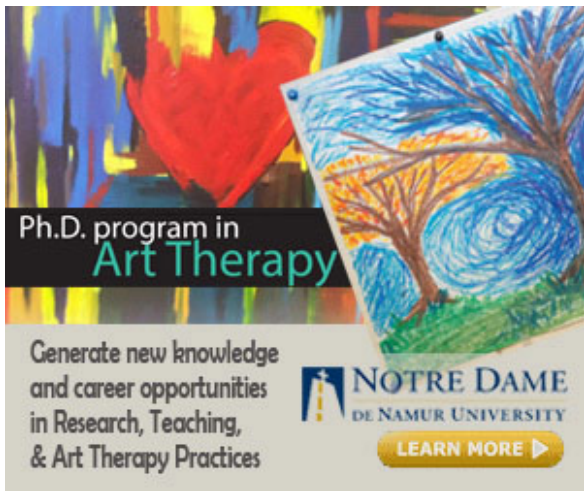

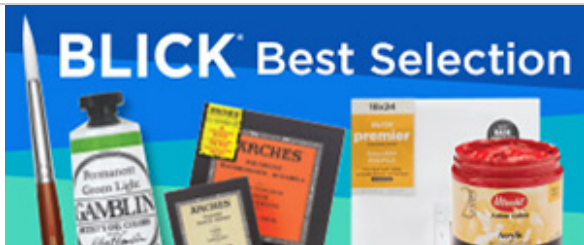
## Mental health and addiction among inmates

Nicole Krystal Crentsil, a 24-year-old assistant project manager from north London, was inspired to put together the show, frustrated by the lack of resources available to young women when they need it most. "There's this expectation of black women to be behind or come last," artist Simone Leigh recently said in an interview with Artsy. The cycle is abhorrent. Black women are subject to innumerable instances of institutionalized racism and sexism every day that undoubtedly lead to anxiety and depression, including but not limited to workplace discrimination, police brutality and mass incarceration.
