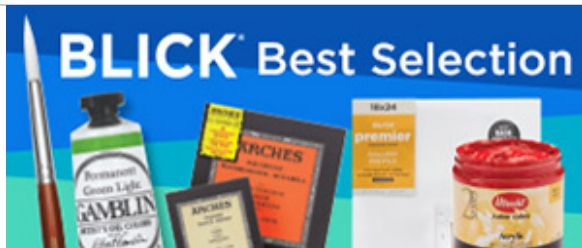

Art therapy helping veterans navigate emotional experiences after war

A few years after the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001, Andrew Schnieders, a high school music teacher in Avon, decided to join the Indiana National Guard. "Here I was, 34 years old, semi accomplished, family in the making, you know, had a 5 year-old and a 3 year-old and things are going well, but we're in this war," Schnieders said. In 2009, Schneiders, with the Army branch of the Guard, was sent on a 13-month deployment to Balad, Iraq, with the 38th Combat Aviation Brigade. The stress of combat and the constant grind of 12 and 14 hour days – including a 10-month stretch without a single day off – took a toll. [READ MORE](#)
