# **Journal Resources for Practicing Cultural Competence**







Although racial and ethnic minorities as a whole comprise approximately 30 percent of the U.S. population, and comprise a similar percentage of those receiving mental health services according to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, this diversity is not reflected in the behavioral health workforce. According to another report by SAMHSA, racial minorities account for only: 19.2 percent of all psychiatrists; 5.1 percent of psychologists; 17.5 percent of social workers; 10.3 percent of counselors; and 7.8 percent of marriage and family therapists. The field of art therapy faces a similar homogenous demographic, with only 12.2 percent of participating art therapists identifying as ethnic or racial minorities in a 2013 survey (Elkins et al., 2013). 
