The Arts Contribute More Than \$760 Billion to the US Economy

New data released today by the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) and the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) offers an insightful picture of the impact the arts have on the nation's economy. The arts contribute \$763.6 billion to the U.S. economy, more than agriculture, transportation, or warehousing. The arts employ 4.9 million workers across the country with earnings of more than \$370 billion. Furthermore, the arts exported \$20 billion more than imported, providing a positive trade balance. **READ MORE**
