The House of Representatives has decisively rejected a proposal to cut funding for the National Endowment of the Arts and the National Endowment of the Humanities by 15 percent. Representative Glenn Grothman, Republican of Wisconsin, put forward an amendment to the government funding bill that would have cut each agency's budget by \$23 million in 2019. But on July 18, the proposal was sent to a resounding defeat by a vote of 297 to 114. READ MORE


