## House Backs Suicide Hotline Bill, Could Lead to 3-Digit Dial Code







Roll Call

The National Suicide Prevention Hotline is headed for an overhaul, with passage of a House bill July 23. The bipartisan proposal would move towards creating a new national three-digit dialing code — similar to 911 — to be used for a mental health crisis and suicide prevention hotline. The House passed the bill by an overwhelming, 379-1, margin. Michigan Republican Justin Amash cast the lone nay vote against the bill, sponsored by Republican Rep. Chris Stewart of Utah. READ MORE
