[AB 211](#) **(Cedillo D) Workers' compensation: permanent disability benefits.**

Summary: Current law establishes a workers' compensation system, administered by the Administrative Director of the Division of Workers' Compensation, to compensate an employee for injuries sustained in the course of his or her employment. Current law, for injuries that cause permanent partial disability and occur on or after January 1, 2004, provides supplemental job displacement benefits in the form of a nontransferable voucher for education-related retraining or skill enhancement for an injured employee who does not return to work for the employer within 60 days of the termination of temporary disability, in accordance with a prescribed schedule based on the percentage of an injured employee's disability. Current law provides an exception for employers who meet specified criteria. This bill would provide that the above provisions shall apply to injuries occurring on or after January 1, 2004, and before January 1, 2012. This bill contains other related provisions.

Summary: Current law provides for the licensure and regulation of structural pest control operators by the Structural Pest Control Board within the Department of Pesticide Regulation. This bill would prohibit a city, county, or city and county from prohibiting a licensee of the board from engaging in the particular business, occupation, or profession for which he or she is licensed.

Summary: Current law defines a vertebrate pest for purposes of provisions requiring the Secretary of Food and Agriculture to establish and administer a research program to control vertebrate pests, including soliciting and considering research proposals for alternative humane methods of control. This bill would authorize the use of carbon monoxide for the control of vertebrate pests, subject to specified provisions governing pest control operations and the use of agricultural chemicals.

Summary: Would, on and after July 1, 2012, authorize the Department of General Services to direct all state agencies, departments, boards, and commissions to establish the goal to achieve 25% small business participation in state procurements and contracts each fiscal year, to ensure that the state's procurement and contract processes are administered in order to meet or exceed the goal, and to report to the Director of General Services statistics regarding small business participation in the agency's procurements and contracts. This bill contains other related provisions.

Summary: Would enact the Healthy Schools Act of 2011. The bill would require all schoolsites, as defined and except as specified, to send at least one person to one of the Department of Pesticide Regulation trainings at least once every 3 years. Because this provision would impose additional duties on local public employees, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program. The bill would further authorize a person from a single school district to attend the training on behalf of multiple schoolsites within that school district. This bill contains other related provisions and other current laws.
