KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



DR. BOBBY CORRIGAN, PHD

BOBBY CORRIGAN HAS BEEN ACTIVE IN URBAN PEST MANAGEMENT FOR OVER 30 YEARS. HE SERVES A CONSULTANT WHO SPECIALIZES IN URBAN RODENT PEST MANAGEMENT ON A NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL SCALE AND ALSO AS A RODENT CONTROL CONSULTANT FOR SEVERAL CITIES AROUND THE USA. BOBBY WAS A MEMBER OF THE PURDUE UNIVERSITY ENTOMOLOGY DEPARTMENT FOR 16 YEARS AS A TEACHER AND RESEARCHER IN RODENT IPM. HE ALSO RAN A PEST MANAGEMENT ROUTE IN NYC FOR THREE YEARS FULL TIME DOING COCKROACH AND RODENT CLEAN OUTS IN RESTAURANTS, OFFICE BUILDINGS, SEWERS AND APARTMENT BUILDINGS WHILE

SAVING MONEY FOR COLLEGE. DR. CORRIGAN HAS LECTURED IN 45 STATES AND 9 COUNTRIES AROUND THE WORLD. BOBBY HOLDS AN A.A.S DEGREE IN PEST CONTROL (STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK); A B.S (URBAN ENTOMOLOGY) FROM PURDUE UNIVERSITY, AND HIS MASTERS AND PH.D. DEGREES IN RODENT CONTROL ALSO FROM PURDUE. DR. CORRIGAN WAS INDUCTED INTO THE PEST MANAGEMENT HALL OF FAME IN 2008.



DINI M. MILLER

DINI M. MILLER IS A PROFESSOR AT THE VIRGINIA TECH UNIVERSITY, AND THE URBAN PEST MANAGEMENT SPECIALIST FOR THE STATE OF VIRGINIA. DR. MILLER IS AN INTERNATIONALLY RECOGNIZED EXPERT IN THE AREA OF URBAN PEST MANAGEMENT, PARTICULARLY BED BUG BIOLOGY, BEHAVIOR AND CONTROL. SHE HAS PRODUCED A NUMBER OF BED BUG ACTION PLANS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF INFESTATIONS IN DIFFERENT ENVIRONMENTS, AND PUBLISHED ONE OF THE FIRST SCIENTIFIC PAPERS EVALUATING MODERN BED BUG RESPONSE TO INSECTICIDE TREATMENTS IN THE FIELD. DINI MILLER RECEIVED HER UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE FROM UCLA IN 1991 WHERE SHE MAJORED IN GEOGRAPHY/ECOSYSTEMS. SHE COMPLETED HER MASTERS (1994) AND Ph.D. DEGREES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA (1998)

WHERE SHE STUDIED URBAN ENTOMOLOGY, SPECIFICALLY GERMAN COCKROACH BIOLOGY AND AGGREGATION BEHAVIOR. DR. MILLER HAS WON NUMEROUS AWARDS FOR HER WORK IN URBAN ENTOMOLOGY.



BRIAN R. LEAHY

BRIAN LEAHY WAS APPOINTED DIRECTOR OF THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PESTICIDE REGULATION (DPR) ON FEB. 2, 2012, BY GOVERNOR BROWN. PRIOR TO JOINING DPR, MR. LEAHY SERVED AS ASSISTANT DIRECTOR FOR THE DIVISION OF LAND RESOURCE PROTECTION IN THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION FOR FIVE YEARS. MR. LEAHY SERVED AS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR THE CALIFORNIA ASSOCIATION OF RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICTS FROM 2004 TO 2006 AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR THE CALIFORNIA CERTIFIED ORGANIC FARMERS FROM 2000 TO 2004. IN 1980, HE BECAME ONE OF CALIFORNIA'S PIONEERING ORGANIC AND BIODIVERSITY FARMERS WHEN HE TOOK OVER OPERATIONS OF CHEROKEE RANCH INC., A 900-ACRE RICE FARM IN BUTTE COUNTY

THAT CONVERTED TO ORGANIC FARMING PRACTICES, A NATIVE CALIFORNIAN, MR, LEAHY GREW UP IN ONTARIO, HE EARNED A JURIS DOCTORATE DEGREE AND HAS WORKED AS A LEGAL AID ATTORNEY.

GAIL RECEIVED HER BS IN ENTOMOLOGY FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY IN 1992. SHE CONTINUED HER EDUCATION AT UC BERKELEY AND RECEIVED HER MS IN WOOD SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY IN 1996. SHE IS A BOARD CERTIFIED ENTOMOLOGIST WITH THE ENTOMOLOGICAL SOCIETY OF AMERICA. SHE IS CURRENTLY SERVING ON THE NATIONAL PEST MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION'S

TECHNICAL BOARD. SHE HAS ALSO SERVED AS AN EXPERT WITNESS IN NUMEROUS BED BUG, TERMITE, BEETLE AND COCKROACH LITIGATION. GAIL GETTY HAS MADE NUMEROUS MEDIA APPEARANCES, SUCH AS, MSNBC NIGHTLY NEWS WITH BRIAN WILLIAMS IN MAY 2007.



CINDY MANNES, VP PUBLIC AFFAIRS NPMA, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR PROFESSIONAL PEST MANAGMENT ALLIANCE AT NPMA

CINDY MANNES IS THE VICE PRESIDENT OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS FOR THE NATIONAL PEST MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION, AS WELL AS THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE PROFESSIONAL PEST MANAGEMENT ALLIANCE. THESE TWO POSITIONS ARE INSTRUMENTAL IN SUPPORTING THE PEST MANAGEMENT INDUSTRY. AS THE VICE PRESIDENT OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS, MANNES IS RESPONSIBLE FOR EDUCATING CONSUMERS ABOUT ALL FACETS OF PEST MANAGEMENT AND PROVIDING A UNIFIED VOICE TO THE AMERICAN PUBLIC. AS THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR THE PROFESSIONAL PEST MANAGEMENT ALLIANCE (PPMA), MANNES IS RESPONSIBLE FOR FULFILLING THE MISSION OF THE ORGANIZATION,

WHICH INCLUDES GROWING, PROTECTING, PROMOTING AND DEFENDING THE INDUSTRY. MANNES IS ALSO RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE NATIONAL ADVERTISING AND PUBLIC RELATIONS PROGRAMS, DIGITAL INITIATIVES AND ALL ONLINE EFFORTS AS WELL AS SEMINARS AND PROGRAMS DESIGNED TO ELEVATE THE PROFESSIONALISM OF ALL INDIVIDUALS INVOLVED WITH THE INDUSTRY. DR. NIAMH QUINN, PHD

NIAMH QUINN IS THE NEW UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA COOPERATIVE EXTENSION HUMAN-WILDLIFE INTERACTIONS ADVISOR, BASED AT THE SOUTH COAST RESEARCH AND EXTENSION CENTER IN IRVINE. SHE FACILITATES INTERACTIONS AND INFORMATION EXCHANGE AMONG CAMPUS BASED ACADEMICS, CE ADVISORS AND COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS. HER FOCUS IS DIRECTED ON THE COORDINATION OF COOPERATIVE EXTENSION PROGRAMMING REGARDING HUMAN-WILDLIFE CONFLICTS, PARTICULARLY WITHIN THE RESIDENTIAL AND INDUSTRIAL AREAS WITHIN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA WHERE SIGNIFICANT HUMAN-WILDLIFE CONFLICTS

ARE OCCURRING WITH CONCENTRATION IN LOS ÁNGELES, ORANGE, AND SAN DIEGO COUNTIES. HUMAN-WILDLIFE CONFLICTS INCLUDE INCREASINGLY CRITICAL ISSUES SUCH AS NEGATIVE IMPACTS OF WILD OR FERAL MAMMALS AND BIRDS IN AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION, FOOD SAFETY, PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY, FORESTRY AND NATURAL RESOURCE CONSERVATION. NIAMH'S PREVIOUS RESEARCH EFFORTS HAVE FOCUSED ON HUMAN-WILDLIFE CONFLICTS IN CALIFORNIA NUT CROPS AND LOWLAND RICE ECOSYSTEMS IN SOUTHEAST ASIA. SHE EARNED A BS IN ZOOLOGY AND PHD IN SMALL MAMMAL ECOLOGY, BOTH FROM NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF IRELAND, GALWAY.
