CTA will continue to communicate member outreach efforts by email.

Upcoming CARGO PAC Events/Review of Central Valley Event

CTA staff and the CARGO PAC Chair discussed the Central Valley CARGO PAC event held earlier this month. The event was a successful fundraiser with many local elected officials and members in attendance. A second and third CARGO PAC event will be held in September. One will be held in the San Joaquin Unit and the other in the LA/Orange Unit. CTA will be sending out information soon regarding the September event. All events are planned with the assistance of AimPoint Consulting. The services of AimPoint were approved by the CARGO PAC board earlier this year. The CARGO PAC Chair talked about the importance of members attending as well as the importance of reaching out to their peers and urging them to attend.

Upcoming Tours for Pilots and Demos
