LEASE CONSTRUCT

• The General Services Administration (GSA) holds the primary authority for Federal real property lease acquisition. Leasing performed by GSA focuses primarily on Office Type Space, not on Clinical/Medical space required to house functions such as those contained within an outpatient clinic. With VA's ability to directly procure Clinical/Medical space, GSA has delegated authority to VA to procure these vital facilities through lease construct.

- For developers, architects and contractors interested in getting involved in lease construct projects, what does VA recommend as the best venue for obtaining information for upcoming lease construct opportunities.
- o Please share the currently planned lease construct projects for FY19, FY20.

REVISE AND STREAMLINE THE VA ACQUISITION REGULATION

- AGC understands the VA is proposing to amend and update its VA Acquisition Regulation (VAAR). Under this initiative, all VA regulations will be reviewed in phased increments in order to: Revise or remove any policy that has been superseded by changes in the FAR; to remove any procedural guidance that is internal to the VA; and to incorporate any new regulations or policies.
 - o Please speak to this proposal to update and streamline the VAAR?
 - This VAAR revision would include Part 836 of VAAR: Specific Aspects of Contracting for Construction; Contract Clauses; and Architect-Engineer Services. What changes can the industry expect to Part 836 of the VAAR?
 - o Please speak to the proposed VAAR revisions already proposed:
 - Removing Letters of Availability;
 - Updating the Insurance Under Fixed-Price Contracts section, to clarify the provision prescription for when insurance is required for solicitations when utilizing term or continuing fixed priced contracts for ambulance, automobile and aircraft service;
 - Updating the language regarding the prohibition of contractors from making reference in its commercial advertising regarding VA contracts in order to avoid implying that the Government approves or endorses products or services; and
 - Adding a new section to encourage making payments to small business contractors within 15 days of receipt of invoice.
 - o What is the timeframe for a rollout of the updated VAAR?
 - When the VAAR is finalized, how will it affect projects that are ongoing before the VAAR update? Will the new rules be retroactive?

VA CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM INTERNAL IMPROVEMENTS

- In 2015, AGC put forth a host of internal improvements¹ the VA may consider to advance its construction program. Those improvements included: establishing decisions review boards; implementing recommendations from industry peer reviews; adoption of an RMS-type electronic construction management system; utilization of standardized VA facility designs, allowing for industry input on draft RFPs; instituting constructability reviews; and training for construction personnel. We understand that VA has implemented at least some of these suggested improvements and may be working on others.
