Description:

Training will prepare participants for their certification exams. Instructors will review the National Pesticide Applicator Certification Core Manual, NH Code of Administrative Rules, and the following categories: Turf (G2), Ornamental (G1), Right of Way (B) and Mosquito & Black Fly (F2). There are also two sessions of the “Core” training. Anyone who hasn’t yet taken the core training and wishes to obtain a General Use Certificate is required to take one of the two training sessions.

New Hampshire requires that anyone applying pesticides commercially must be certified as a commercial pesticide applicator. This certification is required regardless of whether the applicator gets paid for the service or the pesticide is classified as general or restricted use. This includes over-the-counter homeowner-type pesticides.
