Shaping the Future Sponsorship Program

Using their preferred means of expression (such as poetry, visual art, music, and more), students from Canadian High Schools share their vision of a world that fosters a hate-free society by embracing the Black experience.

Students will work in teams of 1-5 to prepare their submissions, strong participation of Black students within these teams is encouraged.


Selected students are from Canadian high schools (or seeking equivalent educational certification in Canada), within focused communities across the country.

Through partnerships with high-school students nationwide, we will provide:

- Scholarships and bursaries awarded to participating students based on the analysis and evaluation of their program submissions. These bursaries can go towards a post-secondary education program.
- Coordination between youth participants to the pool of mentors from various industries.
- Access to customized virtual learning series, training programs, workshops, co-op, or internship opportunities via sponsoring organizations.
- Access to a series of workshops on mental health and counselling services.
- A donation to an approved charitable organization for youth who have completed the highest number of volunteer hours within their community.
