

CALL FOR PARTICIPANTS

Technical Committee on Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion in Apprenticeship Programs

March 17, 2022

Dear Members and Stakeholders,

CSA Group is inviting interested expert stakeholders to apply for membership on a new Technical Committee (TC) on Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion in Apprenticeship Programs. This TC will be responsible for the development and maintenance of a new Standard, *CSA Z301, Equity, diversity and inclusion in apprenticeship programs*. The development of this National Standard is being funded by the Canadian District of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America (UBCJA).

Scope:

The scope of the National Standard will be focused on the following official apprenticeship trades represented within the UBCJA, and included in the UBCJA apprenticeship program delivery:

- a) carpenter;
- b) cabinet maker;
- c) floorcovering installer;
- d) industrial mechanic (millwright);
- e) machinist;
- f) roofer;
- g) insulator; and,
- h) welder.

The scope of the National Standard will clarify that other apprenticeship trades not represented by the UBCJA can use CSA Z301 as they deem appropriate and in accordance with the requirements of the authority having jurisdiction (AHJ).

It is intended that TC members will be able to provide diverse and expert stakeholder input on national requirements representing the following interest categories:

- a) **User Interest** those who predominantly represent the interests and needs of apprentices and apprenticeship program students;
- b) **User Community**—those representing organizations developing cooperative and collaborative approaches and practices within a community, not solely focused on apprenticeship issues, and support equity-seeking groups in overcoming barriers to equal access, opportunities and

resources. This category may include representatives having broad or integrated stakeholder interests, or, those with academic interests. Subject matter experts on EDI may be included in this category;

- C) Organization Interest those who predominantly represent apprenticeship programs including
 post-secondary institution or education organizations. Senior leadership, faculty, and other
 institution associates may be included;
- d) **Government and/or Regulatory Authority**—those who are predominantly involved in regulating apprenticeship programs and/or those authorized by law to set, govern, and enforce OHS-related training requirements in Canada.
- e) **Employer Interest** those who represent employers in the subject trades, including those providing work placements to apprentices (may include representatives of trade associations); This group is intended to represent interests of employers with respect to objectives to support equity, diversity and inclusion in apprenticeship programs.

What is expected?

- Strong interest and knowledge of equity, diversity, and inclusion in apprenticeship, training, or educational programs.
- Active participation and ability to work on a TC virtually.
- Ability to work in a multi-stakeholder environment, following the principles of consensus.
- Representation of a stakeholder category as outlined above.
- Participation at approximately 8-10 virtual TC meetings.
- Note: All meetings for this project will be held virtually.
- Ability to independently support your virtual participation activities on the committee.

 Note: CSA Group is not able to provide funding support for participation at this time; however, should additional funding be secured, this support will be allocated to those with the greatest need (as identified at the start of the standards development project).

The virtual kick off meeting for the CSA Z301 TC is planned to be held in June 2022.

Benefits of participation

- Contribution into the development of a new National Standard of Canada (NSC), and an
 opportunity to positively impact apprenticeship programs, with the intent of improving
 outcomes for apprentices in the subject trades.
- Influence the content of the framework and identify key requirements with respect to issues that are important to you, your interest category, and your organization.
- Stay abreast of developments in Canada in this important area.
- Collaborate and build relationships with other key stakeholders.

How to express interest in membership

CSA Group is committed to cultivating, fostering and preserving a culture of diversity, equity and inclusion. We welcome responses to our Calls for Participation, and applications for membership, from qualified individuals with diverse backgrounds, cultures, perspectives, and experiences who would contribute to the development and quality of our standards.

In addition to member qualifications and skill sets, CSA Group must also consider committee balance, regional participation and presence. This may impact our ability to place all applicants on committees. We will post information on opportunities to contribute through Public Review and any stakeholder engagement events.

If you are interested in applying for membership on the Technical Committee (TC), please complete the CSA Membership Application (attached) along with a resume or brief bio, and outline your applicable expertise to Andrea Holbeche, Project Manager, Worker and Public Safety, by **April 14, 2022**.

CSA Group recognizes that active participation on a standards development committee is a significant commitment, and we thank you for taking the time to apply. All interested stakeholders will be notified of the status of their application by May 6, 2022.

INFORMATION FOR COMMITTEE MEMBER APPLICANTS

The Organization

CSA Group is a not-for-profit, member-based association serving business, industry, government and consumers in the global marketplace.

As a solutions-oriented organization, we work around the world to develop standards that address real needs, such as enhancing public safety and health, advancing the quality of life, helping to preserve the environment and facilitating trade.

CSA Group works as a facilitator bringing together the knowledge and expertise of its members to develop standards needed by society and the marketplace. Committee members contribute their time and technical expertise, working to reach consensus on the scope and content of a standard. CSA Group's success in achieving its purpose is dependent on its members and staff working together.

Members of CSA Group must abide by the by-laws that govern the organization and activities of the Canadian Standards Association.

Types of Committee Membership

There are various committees, councils and boards within the CSA Group Member organization structure. Details are provided here on the two most prevalent committee types; Technical Committees and Technical Subcommittees.

Technical Committees (TCs)

Members of Technical Committees are designated as voting or non-voting based on various factors. A voting member is assigned to an interest category as part of a balanced matrix of stakeholders defined for that Technical Committee and is obligated to respond to formal ballots issued for the standard under development. A non-voting member will also contribute their expertise and stakeholder perspectives relevant to the standard and will be asked to submit comments, rather than vote, during formal ballots.

Technical Subcommittees (TSCs)

Technical Committees may decide to create a Technical Subcommittee(s) to support the development of the standard, or various portions of the standard. In order to maintain communication and continuity between the Technical Committee and Technical Subcommittees, the Chair and other members of the Technical Subcommittee may also be members of the 'parent' Technical Committee.

The role of the Technical Subcommittee is to prepare recommendations and / or draft the content of the standard for formal approval by the Technical Committee.

Committee Appointment

With the concurrence of the CSA Project Manager, the Executive Committee or Chair may authorize appointment to a Committee based on the following:

- Qualifications of the applicant
- Managing the size of each committee so that the committee is able to function efficiently while representing relevant interests and technical expertise
- Specific to Technical Committees, maintaining a balance of interests within the membership

Requirements of Committee Membership

In becoming a Committee Member, the individual makes a commitment to attend meetings consistently, read and respond to committee materials, return ballots promptly, and work constructively and collaboratively toward committee goals. There are no dues associated with CSA membership.

Internet access is necessary to participate in standards development activities through the online CSA Communities and to utilize standards development systems and tools.

As outlined in our by-laws, Members are entitled to one vote in elections for Directors of the Association and at General Meetings of the Association notwithstanding that the Committee Member may be a member of a number of committees, councils or boards of CSA Group.

CSA Group by-laws define and govern the actions of our members in compliance with Canada's **Not-for-profit Corporations Act**. They are an integral part of our commitment to upholding the integrity of our organization.

Young Professionals Member Program

The objective of the CSA Young Professionals Member Program is to encourage and support the future generation of standards developers and ensure their perspectives are reflected in our standards. Typically, a young professional is considered to be someone with less than 10 years of experience. Funding for meeting expenses may be available. A Young Professionals Member Program representative will contact you to further discuss details if you are interested in this Program.

Consumer Program

The importance of including the consumer and end user point of view in developing standards has long been recognized by CSA Group. Our Consumer Program provides for the coordination and support of work, including funding of meeting expenses where needed, by volunteer Members serving as Consumer Representatives at both the national and international levels.
