During that time, she volunteered for K-W Oktoberfest, chaired its Public Relations and Promotions committee, and served on the Executive committee. She was host to former Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau, former Prime Minister Brian Mulroney, actors John Candy, Eugene Levy, Raymond Burr, and John Quade, and sports commentator Tom Cheek.

Martha was on the founding board for Junior Achievement and delivered their program *The Economics of Staying in School* to grades 6, 7 and 8 students for many years.

In 1989, Martha and her husband Doug launched *George Masonry*. The firm specialized in the industrial, commercial and institutional sectors of the construction industry.

Martha and Doug also founded a martial arts studio that currently operates as *Return of the Dragon* and is now owned and operated by their son, Zachary George.

They have three sons, Matthew, Zachary and Joseph, and two grandsons, Alexander and Maximus.
