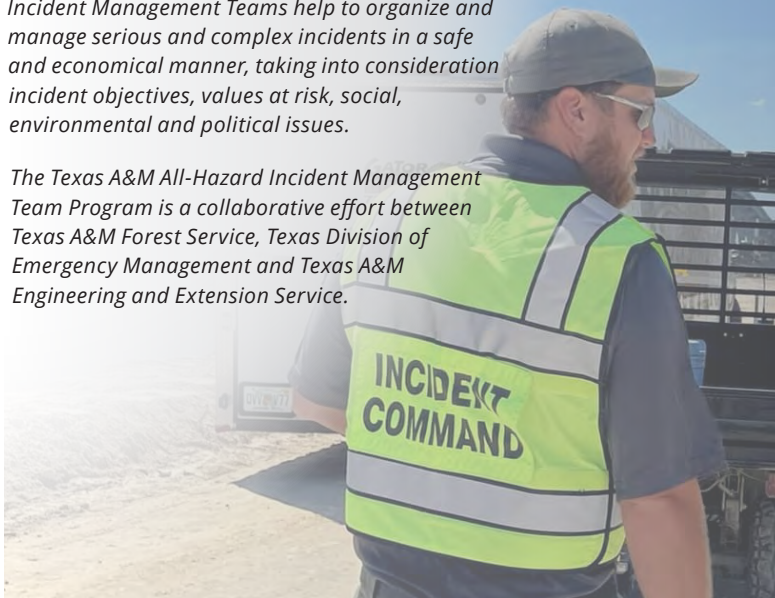


Apply Now! The application period for the Texas A&M All-Hazard Incident Management Team is now open.

Incident Management Teams help to organize and manage serious and complex incidents in a safe and economical manner, taking into consideration incident objectives, values at risk, social, environmental and political issues.

Texas A&M All-Hazard Incident Management Team Program

The Texas A&M All-Hazard Incident Management Team program was established in 2006 as an added component to incident response in Texas. Incident management teams have been requested more frequently to assist local jurisdictions with the management and coordination of response efforts, as the complexity, scope or magnitude of an incident increases.

The most recent iteration, beginning in 2022, revitalized and enhanced the incident management team program. The intent of the newly organized program is to develop a high standard for training, certification and mobilization of incident management teams across the state.

Roles and Responsibilities of the Team

Texas A&M All-Hazard Incident Management Teams support the requesting local authority or agency. Teams are considered all-hazard in discipline due to the varied nature of assistance requests. Teams may be requested to respond to hurricanes, storms, tornadoes, floods, terrorist activities, hazardous materials incidents or wildfires.

Benefits

Participating in the program provides individuals an opportunity to receive specialized training and experience that will also enhance an organization's capacity and knowledge of the Incident Command System.

Who can apply?

The program is currently seeking highly motivated emergency and incident management professionals to participate. Participants should plan to be actively engaged in the program by attending team meetings, participating in training and exercise events and should have availability for assignments.

The application is open to *all* local government employees and individuals willing to support response across the state. Interested candidates should have incident response experience and a desire to further expand their incident management training.

Application Process

Upon receipt of an application, program administration will email the applicant to confirm the application was received and provide information regarding next steps.

Qualified applicants will be invited to participate in an interview with Team Leads. If an individual is accepted into the program following a successful interview, onboarding information will be provided to them.

How to Apply and Required Documentation

Submit an application using the QR Code or visiting bit.ly/TXAHIMTApplication. Applications are accepted year-round.

Certificates for several FEMA courses (IS-100, IS-200, IS-700, IS-800) must be submitted with an application to the program. Include a Red Card or other documentation showing qualifications and prior training.
